VADEMECUM

Welcome to LUISS **MEEG, Master in European Economic Governance**. To help you better understand our program, we have put together this guide which covers most of the issues which might be of interest to you. Please read on and, should you have questions at any point, do get in touch with us.

Location

The program is offered by LUISS School of European Political Economy (SEP) which is located at Via di Villa Emiliani 14 in Rome. The campus is located in the centre of the city and is easily accessible through trams and buses. Those using their own cars should note that there is limited parking.

Program Structure

MEEG is a one-year program corresponding to 60 ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System). The program starts in September and is divided in two semesters – Fall and Spring. Both the semesters are followed by an exam session.

Access to the facilities

Assessment

At the end of each module you are requested to take a verification test that must be sent to the tutor by email no later than the beginning of the next module.

The test will be evaluated by the coordinator of the module with marks given in thirtieths. They will be communicated individually by email, within one and a half months from delivery.

The teaching materials used during the lessons and all other materials provided by the teachers for taking the final test will be distributed by email.

At the end of the master you are required to write a final paper between 10,000 and 15,000 words, which must be sent to the tutor via email no later than the deadline. The deadline will be communicated. The final paper will have to be taken within the framework of the master's modules that you will be assigned on the basis of a triad that you will communicate to the tutor. Within the assigned module, you can freely choose the title of the paper.

In order to obtain the Master' s degree, you need:

- To have sufficient marks in all the verification tests at the end of each module (including the final paper)

- To have attended classes for at least 80% of the total hours of the master for each term. You are also invited to attend additional activities (conferences, seminars, conferences, etc.) organized by external organizations or by LUISS. The certificates of attendance must be sent to the tutor by mail or in letter form.

The final score (expressed in 110ths) will be drawn from the average of the intermediate tests to which the final test score will be added. In case of plagiarism, it will not be possible to obtain the degree title.
