Course	The political economy of international governance. Global and European aspects

Course Description	The course addresses the issues of international governance following a political economy approach. It considers the conditions that allow for international cooperation without an international government. It draws on the theory of international political economy and global collective action. It applies the conceptual framework to the current system characterized by the absence of a global hegemon and an evolving EU and euro zone institutional architecture. It evaluates the interaction between EU integration and structural reforms in addressing the challenge of secular stagnation in Europe
